Jan could see how worried Marsha was. Even though Jan was looking forward to an evening with her friends, she knew what she had to do. Jan said, "How about if I come over to your house and we fix dinner together?" "You'd do that for me?" said Marsha. "I thought tonight was your pizza night with your friends." "It's OK," said Jan. "Just let me call my friends to let them know I'll see them next week."

Jan put Marsha's needs first. Even though she'd looked forward to eating out with her friends, Jan knew Marsha needed someone to be with her before the surgery. Jan gave up her night out with her friends to spend time with Marsha and help her. Jan put Marsha first.

Our best friend Jesus put our needs first when God sent him to save us. Jesus could have stayed in heaven. Jesus could have walked away from the cross and the pain he would suffer there. But Jesus loves us so much he died on the cross to save us from the punishment we deserve because of our sins. Because Jesus died and then rose from death for us, we have God's forgiveness and a home in heaven.

The Bible verse in today's reading reminds us to put others first. (Reread the Bible verse.) Jesus put us first and God wants us to show this love in the same way.
